The Drug Free Youth in Santa Clarita Valley (**DFY in SCV**) junior high and high school clubs are led by students for students! The program is a collaboration between the City of Santa Clarita, William S. Hart Union High School District, Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department and County of Los Angeles Fifth Supervisorial District to educate and engage youth on being and staying drug free.

The voluntary drug prevention and education program, **DFY in SCV**, educates and empowers students to make good choices leading toward positive and healthy behaviors. The curriculum continues to teach communication and lifelong skills to combat negative peer pressure and easy-to-remember strategies to say no, and provides an understanding of over the counter drugs, prescription drugs, alcohol/binge drinking, inhalants, marijuana/smoking and hard drugs.

Student officers decide what activities, speakers and community service projects are best for their school. The program educates students on the temptation of substance use, sending powerful messages of self-control and responsibility, and connects students with a drug-free peer culture. **DFY in SCV** provides a support system by surrounding students with like-minded friends.
